Combine the elements of mystery, surprise, engaging humor and then mix that with old fashioned storytelling and you have the central core of *Proof* by Pulitzer Prize-winning author David Auburn. The 2001 Tony Award winner for Best Play is the story of a troubled young woman, Catherine, who has spent years caring for her mentally unstable father, Robert, who was also a genius mathematician. Catherine must deal with her father's death, the arrival of her estranged sister Claire for their father's funeral, her own volatile and unstable emotions, and the romantic attentions of Hal, one of Robert's former students. The discovery of a mysterious mathematical proof and who wrote it

will have the audience asking the question—just how much of her father's mathematical genius and his madness did Catherine inherit?

TCT veteran actress and director Allana Austin brings the part of Catherine to life on the Lyric stage. Allana, who has "grown up" at TCT, is currently a drama teacher at Tupelo High School.

Keith Gilbert, portraying the role of her father Robert, has worked with TCT for many years behind the scenes, but this is his first time on the Lyric stage. He works at Central Service Association.

Amye Gousset, who plays Claire, is no stranger to TCT audiences. She has been most recently in *Steel Magnolias* and

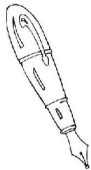
Oklahoma! She works at First United Methodist Church.

Scholarship Application Deadline

Tupelo Community Theatre was formed in the spring of 1969 to develop, promote, teach and stimulate interest in the dramatic arts. During our almost 40 year history, we have held true to that mission and one way we do this is through education. TCT offers three scholarships every year to deserving students. These scholarships honor three individuals who helped TCT to get that dream going: Ruth Liveakos, B.J. Huddleston, and Martha Geddie.

The Liveakos Scholarship and B.J. Huddleston Memorial Art Scholarship are \$500 scholarships recognizing a graduating Tupelo High School Senior who has demonstrated artistic ability, academic achieve-



ment, leadership and good citizenship. The \$500 Martha Geddie Memorial Scholarship is given to a Mississippi student currently enrolled in college with full time student status majoring in speech, oral communications, drama, mass media and/or related fields. Selection is based on achievements in the performing arts and general scholarship.

Carpenter Grant Announced



Tupelo Community Theatre and the historic Lyric Theatre building received a \$10,000 E. R. Carpenter Foundation grant toward a major restoration and upgrade of its 1912 fly loft. The fly loft is the super structure above the stage

containing much of the mechanical action necessary in advanced staging. The total project will cost over \$400,000, with \$136,000 from a Mississippi Arts Commission Building Fund for the Arts program.

Carpenter also announced \$100,000 in grants for five other organizations in Northeast Mississippi. All

of the Carpenter grants, made in communities and regions where it has operations, are related to the arts, education, medical and hospice care. Other recipients were: Catch Kids, Plantersville Middle School, Lawndale Elementary School, New Beginnings, and Tupelo Symphony.

Again, a big THANKS to the Carpenter Foundation for its support of Tupelo Community Theatre and the Building for Our Second Century campaign.

Garry will perform for Tupelo and Lee County students March 28, 29 & 30, provide a teacher workshop on Tuesday, March 27 from 4-6 and present a workshop for the Boys and Girls Club on Wednesday, March 28.

Mary Stremlau, Associate Director, Grand Theater, Wausau, WI says, "Garry Krinsky's show is both literally and figuratively a balancing act. The vaudeville style stunts are first rate. Better yet, he ties and reties each of them back to scientific principals. He has the unique ability to both entertain and educate..."

A free public performance, Thursday, March 29 at 7:30 p.m. at the Lyric is your opportunity to experience this unique performance which marries art and

science in an entertaining package that kids and adults alike are sure to enjoy.

Garry created his *Toying with Science* program in 1995 and has since been touring it across the U.S. and Canada to rave reviews. His performance is fast-paced, varied and dynamic. Commissioned and developed with the Museum of Science in Boston, his performance combines circus skills, mime, original music, and audience involvement. Garry and his audience investigate basic scientific information and delve into the imaginations of scientists who explore our world. During the program, Garry brings his science toys to life with motion, music, humor and insight. He turns audience members into stars as he playfully shares the stage, juggling, balancing and welcoming them into his colorful world as he performs original up-beat songs that explore fulcrums, levers and basic mechanics. He balances five ladders at one time on his chin as he demonstrates how to find the center of gravity! It is incredible how much action, fun and learning takes place in so little time!!!

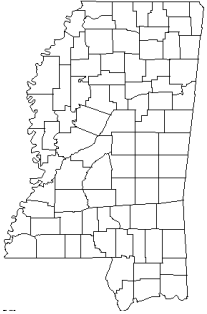
Regional Theatre News

Mississippi Theatre Association recently held its annual festival in January at the Ford Center on the University of Mississippi campus. Tom Booth, TCT Executive Director, was elected president of MTA and will serve a two year term. Lynn Nelson, TCT board member and publicity chair, continues to serve as Community Theatre Division chair. At MTA, Lynn also led a round table discussion for community theatre leaders and volunteers regarding their needs and concerns for their

hometown theatre companies. Congratulations to Starkville Community Theatre for their recent win as "Best Production" at MTA with their production of *Smoke on the Mountain*, one of our TCT patron's favorite shows. It also won awards for overall technical excellence, best director, best supporting actor, best actor and best actress.

Starkville will represent Mississippi at the Southeastern Theatre Conference in Atlanta March 7-11, 2007. TCT was a

winner at SETC in 2004 with our production of *Bel Canto*. A community theatre from Mississippi has been one of the winners at SETC for each of the last three years.

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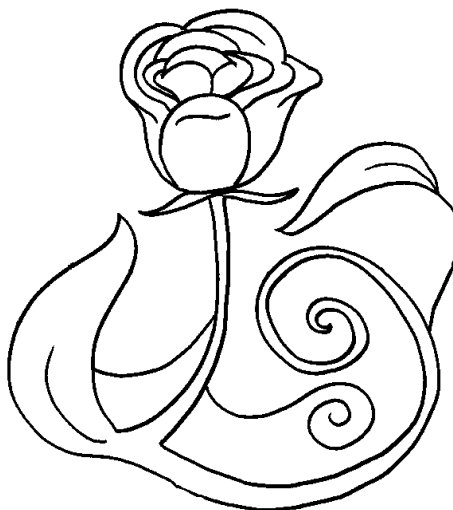

Auditions for Beauty and the Beast

Tupelo Community Theatre announces that auditions for the Gum Tree production of *Disney's Beauty and the Beast* will be held at the Lyric Theatre on Sunday, March 4 at 2:00 P.M. and on Monday, March 5 at 7:00 P.M.

The entire adult cast will have singing parts, so everyone auditioning will be required to sing. There is a single child's part, for a 6 – 10 year old boy. Others auditioning must be at least a junior in high school or older. Those auditioning for the



chorus need not have an audition piece. Everyone auditioning for a principal role should bring a prepared piece of music (preferably a Broadway show tune). An accompanist will be provided.
